Welcome to our 41st season! Once again, we look forward to bringing you some of the world's great choral music.


The first of our three programs celebrates the creativity of women composers. The repertoire covers the gamut from medieval Germany and the Italian Renaissance up to very recent times. Truly a "discovery" concert, the first half of the program introduces you to composers, old and new, from outside the United States. In addition to the aforementioned Germany and Italy, we showcase music from Iceland, Latvia, China, Bulgaria, Canada, and England! The second half of the show features some of the many wonderful composers living and working in the United States who happen to be women. Among these you may recall Dale Trumbore from our June 2019 concert and Nancy Wertsch from prior seasons. We'll conclude the show with a classic arrangement by the great Alice Parker.

The large-scale centerpiece of the season is the grand oratorio *Elijah* by Felix Mendelssohn. Inspired by the large-scale works of Handel and Bach, this epic music-drama recounts the story of the prophet Elijah as told in the Books of 1 Kings and 2 Kings, along with psalms and other Biblical texts. Commissioned by the Birmingham Festival and premiered there in 1846, Mendelssohn wrote it with the English and German texts in parallel so that it could be sung in either language with ease. We will be re-creating the original performance, in English, with the help of wonderful soloists and Jubilate Orchestra playing period instruments of the classical era --tuned at A430.

This season marks my 20th as Artistic Director! Our June concert will feature all things Dolian—music that I have composed over the years for unaccompanied choir. You'll hear a variety of short pieces I have composed for the choir at St. Gregory of Nyssa Church—psalm settings, communion anthems, chant harmonizations, and Christmas motets—as well as secular works I have composed for BCG. We will also premiere a piece I'm composing for the occasion. The program will conclude with some of my choral arrangements of popular songs.

# Mendelssohn: Elijah

Felix Mendelssohn's powerful oratorio Elijah is a masterpiece of the Romantic period inspired by the passions and oratorios of Bach and Handel. Choristers and attendees of our 1986 and 1999 Elijah performances still cite them as among our most memorable concerts. The account of Elijah's prophetic vision and efforts to dissuade his people from the worship of Baal and return them to their faith is infused with human drama, the cataclysmic forces of nature, and rich symbolism. We will be joined in our performances by Jubilate Orchestra and superb soloists.
