The first concert of our 2017-2018 season is a premiere performance of *Messyah*, a work by British composer **Paul Ayres**, and a fresh take on one of the most beloved of all oratorios, Handel's *Messiah*. In *Messyah*, Ayres re-conceives each movement of Handel's original in one of the musical styles that have

appeared in the three centuries since Handel wrote the original. Over the course of the evening we will encounter jazz, gospel, mash-ups, improvisation, sight-gags and more, with all the variations clearly rooted in Handel's beloved melodies and harmonies. As Ayres himself describes: "Sometimes there are changes to metre and rhythm, and sometimes the harmony or text has undergone a transformation. Some movements have had their essential elements distilled into a few moments' intensity, and some musical ideas have been expanded and developed along startlingly tangential lines." *Messyah*—one might think of this as the "messy" version of the original—is a joyous, spirited celebration of the all-time classic.

Although earlier versions of *Messyah* have been performed locally, BCG commissioned Ayres to complete the remaining movements for our December concert. BCG will collaborate with the **Redwood Symphony**, **Erik K** (aka Erik Kujawsky) director, for the world's first presentation of the newly completed *Messyah* score in a traditional choral/orchestral format.

For our March concert, in a return to our roots as the Baroque Choral Guild, we perform **J. S. Bach's** *St. John Passion*, the first of his settings of the biblical Passion story, and one of the true masterworks of the choral repertoire. **Jubilate Orchestra**, the renowned ensemble of period instruments, and a cast of the Bay Area's finest vocal soloists join us to present this challenging virtuoso milestone.

Our season concludes in June with **An English Garden**, a survey of unaccompanied treasures from the English choral tradition, which includes both sacred and secular gems from many eras. The featured works will be *Mass for Five Voices*, by Renaissance master **William Byrd** and a 20th-century classic, *Requiem*, by **Herbert Howells**.



To quote Stephen Smoliar's review of the 2010 SF Conservatory performance, "When Avres cuts loose with his pop settings with jazz combo accompaniment, the joyousness of the result is as true to the religious spirit as was the original setting." This premiere performance of Ayre's newly completed score is funded in part by a grant from Silicon Valley Creates.
